

Most colleges require incoming students to take either the SAT or ACT test, or both. These are national tests, and are administered by different organizations, at varying times of the year. Tests can be taken multiple times. In some cases, vouchers are available for reduced or no-charge tests. Contact your school counselor to find out if that is available. Check with the college(s) you are interested in, to see their admission requirements.

- To register for your SAT, go to College Board (www.collegeboard.org)
- To register for your ACT, go to ACT (www.act.org)

Get help paying for college, by submitting a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid), at www.fafsa.gov. Federal grants require the completion of a FAFSA application each year. In addition to federal grant programs, there are also various federal loan programs.

Some colleges also have various student employment programs, which can help offset some college expenses.

Additionally, various companies, private foundations or government entities offer different types of loans.

Make use of your school counselors and teachers. Research colleges online, and talk to others who are currently attending, have attended, or plan on attending college.

Following is a small sample of colleges found across the region, and nation. Use the expertise located on College Board (www.collegeboard.org), and ACT (www.act.org) to find out additional information about colleges, scholarships, grants, work-study programs and more.

Scholarships - Overview

To select scholarship recipients, the Office of Undergraduate Admissions, the National Alumni Association, and The University of Alabama's undergraduate colleges and schools use the scholarship application on myBama for freshman and transfer students and a separate application for currently enrolled students.

Academic scholarships are merit-based, requiring that students earn certain grade point averages and/or scores on the PSAT, SAT, or ACT to qualify.

Entering freshmen, transfer students, and current University undergraduate students who apply for scholarships will be considered for all scholarships for which they are eligible; except those offered by Air Force ROTC, Army ROTC, and the College of Continuing Studies.

Applicants to UCLA are encouraged to apply for scholarships managed by Financial Aid and Scholarships by completing the scholarship section of their admissions application. Scholarships are awarded to students who meet the specific criteria established by donors, which may include a variety of factors such as student's academic achievements, ethnicity, volunteer work and professional interests. In addition to completing the scholarships section on the application for admission, students must complete and submit the FAFSA or the Dream Act Application by the March 2nd deadline for the year they will be enrolling.

Academic departments and campus organizations offer various scholarship opportunities. If you accept your offer of admission to UCLA, you will have the opportunity to apply for additional scholarship opportunities from your academic departments as a continuing student and from Financial Aid and Scholarships via the continuing student scholarship application.

Financial Aid and Scholarships are awarded based on both academic merit and financial need.

- High school entering students are considered for scholarships with a minimum 4.1 GPA.
- Community college entering students are considered for scholarships with a minimum 3.5 GPA.

The Office of Student Financial Aid (OSFA) at the University of Georgia is a part of the Office of the Vice President for Instruction. We are committed to taking a pro-active role in supporting the recruitment, retention, and academic success of a large and diverse student population. We will advise students of their eligibility for financial assistance in a timely manner and educate them about the financial and academic responsibilities associated with the receipt of that aid. Our goal is to ensure the delivery of student aid funds is conducted accurately, expediently, and with integrity. We will treat all students with care and respect and always maintain the confidentiality of personal information of our students and their families.

Last year, UGA awarded more than \$7 million in scholarships and awards from University Foundation funds to undergraduate students. Most academic (merit-based) scholarships for first-year students are awarded during the Admissions process. Approximately 14% of enrolled first-year students received an academic scholarship from UGA.

Additionally, scholarships available through individual academic departments are typically awarded to upperclassmen, but prospective students should consult the websites of their intended department for more information. Some scholarships for first-year students require an additional application.

All scholarships awarded by the Undergraduate Admissions office are renewable for eight semesters of full-time enrollment, or the completion of a Bachelor's degree. To renew the scholarship each year, students must maintain specific academic requirements which are detailed in the award letter.

Applicants for Federal Student Aid programs must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and Georgia Tech Application for Scholarships and Financial Aid (GT App) annually. The CSS Profile is currently only required for incoming first-year applicants who are also seeking need-based assistance from Georgia Tech funds.

Together, scholarships and grants are known as "gift aid." For many students, they represent an important component of the financial aid package, especially for those with significant demonstrated financial need.

Scholarship awards are made on an annual basis and do not require repayment. Academic excellence, financial need, and major of study are the primary criteria used for selecting recipients. Students awarded scholarships will typically be expected to maintain a cumulative as well as a semester GPA of 3.0.

Generally, students who entered Georgia Tech as freshmen are limited to receiving institutional scholarships for the first eight (8) terms of full-time enrollment. During an academic year, scholarships are generally awarded for two (2) semesters (Fall, Spring, or Summer).

Please note that there are many students who may be equally qualified for a scholarship, however preference is given to students who show financial need and meet the established application deadlines. Individual scholarship applications are not required to apply for listed scholarships on website.

The selection process is extremely competitive and students who submit completed admission application packets by the Early Action deadline (October 15) are automatically considered for merit awards. (A scholarship application form is not required for consideration of an award.) To be considered for a merit based scholarship, students must have a minimum 3.30 cumulative grade point average. A minimum 1100 SAT (EBR & M) or ACT Composite score of 22 is also required. Consideration of a scholarship award is granted, not guaranteed to students who meet minimum eligibility requirements.

- Families at all income levels who have significant assets are asked to pay more than those in less fortunate circumstances.
- Home equity and retirement assets are not considered in our assessment of financial need.



The Financial Aid Office at Jackson State University coordinates financial assistance (federal, state, institutional, and private) offered to students. Our fundamental purpose is to make it possible for students to obtain an education who would otherwise be unable to do so. Financial assistance is awarded to students to assist them with funds needed to pay educational cost, which is the difference between the actual cost of attendance and what a student can afford to pay as determined by the family's Expected Family Contribution (EFC) calculated by FAFSA. A Financial Aid Award may consist of grants, loans, employment, scholarships or a combination of these programs. Students seeking federal financial aid are required to complete FAFSA.

Scholarships received by students may cause financial aid packages to be adjusted. Students must provide the Financial Aid Office with all information relating to scholarships they may receive. This information should include the terms and conditions of the award, the amount of the scholarship(s) and the semester(s) for which the scholarship(s) will be paid. There are 4 types of financial aid: grants, scholarships, loans & work-study. To be eligible for many of these funds, you need to file the FAFSA. Some scholarships are for residents of Kansas, others are for non-residents. Pay attention to admission deadlines.

KU's Renewable Scholarships

KU offers four-year renewable scholarships to incoming first-time freshmen, and two-year renewable scholarships to incoming transfer students.

Private Scholarships

Private, or "outside" scholarships, are those that are awarded from entities other than KU.

Departmental Scholarships

Some KU schools and departments may offer their own scholarships and awards, with varying eligibility criteria. Contact your department for details.

Scholarships and grants are sources of free money and do not need to be repaid. They are an excellent source to help defray the costs of your education. Scholarships and grants can be used to pay the following:

- Cashiering account tuition and fee expenses
- Living expenses while attending school, such as rent, utilities, gasoline, parking pass, books, school supplies, copying or research expenses, and child care costs

Scholarships are monies awarded by UNLV or by private donors based on a variety of criteria established by the scholarship donor and/or the Nevada Board of Regents. Scholarships are disbursed by the Financial Aid & Scholarships Office and recipients are chosen by a variety of methods and on and off campus entities. Scholarship awards may vary year to year, based on available funding. Many scholarship awards are renewable, but some are awarded as a one-time occurrence as specified by the donor.

Grants are monies awarded based on need; the lower the expected family contribution (EFC) as determined by the FAFSA application, the more likely a student may qualify for grant funding. Grants are awarded by UNLV, the state of Nevada, and the U.S. Department of Education utilizing your FAFSA information. Grant dollars have limited financial funding streams.

The Office of Financial Aid exists to assist students in finding ways to finance their college education. Most funds administered by Spelman College's Office of Financial Aid come from federal and state sources. Spelman College will attempt to provide financial assistance to families who have been determined eligible based on the formula approved by Congress and used by the Department of Education. Last year, more than 85 percent of our students received some form of financial assistance to support their enrollment and success.

At Spelman College, we value our students and are committed to making your education affordable. Meeting the cost of an undergraduate education is a significant investment. TCU is committed to enrolling talented, motivated students from diverse backgrounds. The University offers a full range of scholarships, financial aid, and financing options to families of all income levels.

Financial aid is composed of scholarships, grants, work-study, and loans. Students must complete the FAFSA each academic year to determine eligibility for need-based federal and state financial aid. Additionally, incoming students are encouraged to complete the CSS Profile to be considered for all TCU funded aid programs.

The Office of Admission awards academic scholarships to our highest achieving admitted students. Fewer than half of all students admitted to TCU are offered academic scholarships. These competitive awards are based primarily on grades, ACT or SAT score, rank in class (if available), and curriculum rigor.

Grants are based in part on financial eligibility, awards may vary from year to year depending upon the economic situation of the family.

To be considered for maximum grant funding, students must be admitted to UT Arlington and the completed Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and any additional required documents must be received in the Financial Aid Office by the specified due dates. Because additional documents may be required (see Verification), students should complete and submit the FAFSA at least two weeks prior to the deadline.

NOTE: Be wary of organizations that charge a fee to submit your application or to find you money for school. In general, the help you pay for may be obtained for free from us or from the U.S. Department of Education. If you or your family has unusual circumstances (such as loss of employment), complete FAFSA on the Web to the extent you can, then submit the application and consult the Financial Aid Office.

The University of Texas at Austin offers a large and diverse amount of scholarship opportunities to undergraduate and graduate students. One of the main goals of the Office of Student Financial Services, which oversees most of these scholarship awards, is to locate as many eligible students as possible and assist them in funding their education.

From departmental to endowed scholarships, from renewable to one-time awards, there are several types of scholarship options available to UT students. Scholarship funds however are limited and highly competitive. In addition to meeting the criteria for a scholarship, students must meet all the application deadlines to be considered for the largest number of scholarships at UT Austin.

Scholarships typically are awarded by considering three criteria: merit, need, and adversity. Some scholarship committees, which in the beginning of March begin making award decisions for the following academic year, may look at all three of these factors, while others may only consider merit.

All students are strongly encouraged to complete the FAFSA along with their scholarship application to assist in the consideration process.

The University of Texas at Dallas offers many scholarship opportunities for incoming first-time freshmen, transfer students, and graduate students, as well as for all continuing students. Some scholarship programs provide funding throughout the student's undergraduate or graduate career, provided the student meets continuing eligibility requirements. Scholarships are considered a resource. If you receive a scholarship or any financial assistance that is not listed in your award notice, federal regulations require that you report it to the Office of Financial Aid. We will then review and, if necessary, recalculate your overall aid eligibility.

Yale awards all undergraduate financial aid based on financial need, with the goal of making a Yale education affordable for everyone. The resources on this site and the staff at the Office of Undergraduate Financial Aid can help you turn your dream of a Yale education into a reality.

Scholarships and other grants are often referred to as gift aid, because they do not need to be repaid. Such gift aid falls into one of three categories in the Yale financial aid award:

- Yale Scholarship
 - Yale's need-based grant aid for undergraduates, the Yale Scholarship, is a gift and thus never has to be repaid. If a student is awarded financial aid, the Yale Scholarship amount is included on the Financial Aid Award Letter.
- Merit-based Scholarships
 - While Yale does not award merit-based scholarships, Yale students often qualify for merit awards from other organizations. Criteria for receiving merit scholarships are directly linked to a student's performance in academics, sports, music, or another field of special interest.
- **Entitlement Grants**
 - Entitlement grants are awarded by the federal government, state agencies, or other agencies not affiliated with Yale. The criteria for receiving entitlements are based on federal need, city or state of residence, or affiliation with an employer.
