Montgomery G.I. Bill - Active Duty

The MGIB program provides up to 36 months of education benefits. This benefit may be used for degree and certificate programs, flight training, apprenticeship/on-the-job training and correspondence courses. Remedial, deficiency, and refresher courses may be approved under certain circumstances. *Generally, benefits are payable for 10 years following your release from active duty.* This program is also commonly known as Chapter 30.

Montgomery G.I. Bill - Selected Reserve (MGIB-SR)

The MGIB-SR program may be available to you if you are a member of the Selected Reserve. The Selected Reserve includes the Army Reserve, Navy Reserve, Air Force Reserve, Marine Corps Reserve and Coast Guard Reserve, and the Army National Guard and the Air National Guard. This benefit may be used for degree and certificate programs, flight training, apprenticeship/on-the-job training and correspondence courses. Remedial, deficiency, and refresher courses may be approved under certain circumstances. See Payment Rates for current rates of payment.

How to apply for Montgomery G.I. Bill benefits

- First determine if the program is approved for VA benefits (slide 4)
- If the program is not listed or approved have your supervisor contact the VA "<u>STATE APPROVING OFFICIAL</u>" in your state to request approval. (The approval process requires at a minimum: a Single Certifying Point of Contact (P.O.C.), Training outline, Union agreement) and could take 4-8 weeks for approval).
- If the program is an approved program, contact your local city / state VA office for all required documents or obtain them from online (slide 5)

Montgomery G.I. Bill - Determining a program's approval

- Step#1- Click the respective Tab below
- **Step#2** Enter the name of the Institution (most require the word "Burlington")
- **Step#3** Enter the Program Type (OJT, Institute of Higher Learning, etc...)
- Step#4- Click on the state where training or course will be conducted
- Step#5- Click on the training or course that applies under "Search Results"
- Step#6- Click "Programs" next to Institution Profiles
- Step#7- Click the program that applies under "Description" If your school, program, or course appears, that training is approved in that city/state for eligible G.I Bill benefits.
